MISSOURI DROUGHT RESOURCES

Drought: a period of little to no precipitation having an adverse effect on crops, farmland, the economy, livestock, and humans.



Severe drought conditions continue across most of northern Missouri. Farmers may experience a decrease in crop production, feed, and other agricultural products, causing significant financial and lifestyle stress. Drought affected farmers, ranchers, and their families may experience psychological and behavioral health changes, financial hardships, stress, or strain on interpersonal relationships.
